2011 Annual WBC Craftsmanship Awards

DC Building Industry Honors the Area's Most Talented Craftsmen

On March 25th, over 1,000 individuals from Washington's building industry gathered at the Marriott Wardman Park Hotel to recognize the area's top craftsmen and women at the Washington Building Congress' Annual Craftsmanship Awards celebration.

"The Craftsmanship Awards has grown to be one of the most prestigious events in our industry and is the only program in the metropolitan Washington area recognizing craftsmen individually," said Chuck Asmar, WBC's 73rd Chairman of the Board. "In the last 55 years over 8,900 craftsmen have been recognized for their craftsmanship on over 2,800 winning projects."

As in previous years, up to five deserving craftsmen may be nominated by the WBC Craftsmanship Awards Committee and approved by the WBC Board of Directors to be inducted in the Craftsmen Hall of Fame.

"The Hall of Fame provides an excellent way to properly recognize the 'best of the best' in our industry," explained Asmar.

Selection of the Hall of Fame inductees is based on the number of awards an individual has received, the individual's time in the building industry, and other special factors that may be relevant. This year, four individuals were selected to receive this high praise. The night's 2011 Hall of Fame inductees were:

- **Beri Bonacic**
- **Mark D. Bougher**
- **Anthony D. Davis**
- **Regis J. Studeny, Jr.**

In response to the Craftsmanship Awards Call for Entries that went out last September, WBC received a record 278 nominations in 10 trade categories from sitework to finishes. In early January of this year, judges went out to evaluate all of the nominated projects. After the results were compiled, 78 winning entries were chosen. (A complete listing of the winning projects follows, and a complete list with project descriptions is available online at www.wbcnet.org.)

Very few companies had winning craftsmen on more than one or two projects, however craftsmen from Dynalectric Company were awarded for seven projects (plus one more for DynaTran Div., Dynalectric Company), and those from J.E. Richards, Inc. were awarded for four projects (including one as J.E. Richards, Inc./Native Sons Joint Venture).

Clark Construction Group, LLC was general contractor on 22 projects (including three as a Joint Venture partner with Balfour Beatty Construction); The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company was general contractor on 14 projects; and Turner Construction Company was general contractor on seven projects (including one as a joint venture partner with Gilbane Building Company).

After the Craftsmanship Award winners were selected, a separate group of Star Award evaluators representing different perspectives and disciplines within our industry was selected to independently evaluate the Star Award nominees. Ten outstanding entries were also recommended for Star Awards this year for demonstrating the highest level of quality and exceeding the awards criteria to achieve a level defined as "Exceptional." From these, the Star Award winners for Visual Excellence, Technical Excellence and Excellence in the Face of Adversity were selected.

This year, the Star Award for Visual Excellence was awarded to the team of **Earl Ferguson** and **Tom Gulley** with Cleveland Construction, Inc. for their outstanding *Acoustical Ceiling* work at The Arena Stage Expansion and Renovation.

Glen Connors, Chris Harper, David Ridings, Greg Ward, Jeff Waugerman, and Jon Whiston with Dynalectric Company were honored with the Excellence in the Face of Adversity Star Award for their *Power Generation, Distribution and Switchgear* work at the Equinix Data Center.

Finally, the Star Award for Technical Excellence was presented to **Elmer Amaya, Ann Gaines, Dennis Larkin, Jon Scott Lindsey, Jr., Jon Scott Lindsey, Sr., and Edwin Sanchez** with Independent Custom Metalworks, LLC for their *Ornamental Metal* work at the U.S. Institute of Peace Headquarters.

Washington has awarded **Grunley/Goel Joint Venture, LLC**, a joint venture between Grunley Construction Co., Inc. and Goel Services, Inc. (GGJV), a \$13 million contract to design and construct a 40,000 square-foot single-story Child Development Center at Patuxent River, Md. Naval Air Station. The facility will provide child care, family home care, pre-school enrichment programs, and before and after school programs for approximately 300 military personnel children. The design team will work to design the building to achieve a LEED® 2.2 Silver certification. The new center will be designed to allow plenty of natural lighting into the corridors and have a homelike feel. The child activity rooms will be inviting and provide a conducive learning environment. Activity rooms will be grouped by age ranging from infant to toddler. Other spaces include support staff offices and a full service kitchen. The exterior will have a residential character using a brick façade, metal panel roof, and aluminum framed doors and windows. The design is expected to be complete by January 2012; construction is scheduled for completion in June 2012.

Suffolk Construction Company's recently completed **Commonwealth II** project has received LEED Platinum certification. Commonwealth II is a five-story, 162,000 square-foot office building and neighboring 262-space parking garage at Commonwealth Centre at Westfield's, located in Chantilly, Va. The project team exceeded the original goal of LEED Silver to earn 45 points, and was subsequently awarded LEED Platinum certification. Upon earning Platinum certification, the highest recognition possible for energy and environmental design excellence, Commonwealth II is now recognized as the first office building in Northern Virginia to achieve this level of LEED certification, the fifth in the entire state of Virginia. Suffolk was recently ranked #30 in the nation's Top Green Contractors listing in *ENR* magazine.

Additionally, **Suffolk Construction Company** recently broke ground on the new \$42 million clubhouse proj-



ect at the **Army Navy Country Club** in Arlington, Va. This new 100,000 square-foot, four-story clubhouse facility will be one of the largest clubhouses in the Washington, DC metropolitan area. Site improvements include a 10,000 square-foot cart barn, 5,000 square-foot maintenance building, 100-space cast-in-place parking structure, and 18 clay tennis courts. Sustainable building practices provide environmental, health and economic benefits to the occupants, the community and the environment as a

whole. Currently, the project is slated to achieve a LEED Gold certification.

NaylorCMG has chosen Bethesda, MD-based, **Frost Miller Group** (FMG), to promote the upcoming USA Pavilion at Americas Food & Beverage Show in Miami, Fl. The 15th Annual USA Pavilion at Americas Food & Beverage Show will be the 13th promotional campaign produced for Fairfax, VA-based NaylorCMG by FMG. The agency previously worked on Worldwide Food Expo, AMI Expo, InterBev, the Mid-Atlantic Food, Beverage & Lodg-

ing Expo, U.S. Food Showcase, and others. The integrated marketing communications firm will immediately begin creating exhibitor marketing materials and executing exhibitor acquisition campaigns. In addition to designing direct mail pieces, web graphics and e-mail templates, FMG will implement a social media campaign for the November 14-15th, 2011 show, utilizing Twitter to communicate with USA Pavilion exhibitors and show attendees.

In addition, **Frost Miller Group** was hired by **NaylorCMG** to promote the UMA Motorcoach EXPO in Long Beach, Ca. on February 8-12, 2012. This is the first time Bethesda, MD-based Frost Miller Group will work in conjunction with Naylor on the oldest trade show for the motorcoach sector in the US. The integrated marketing communications firm will immediately start producing exhibitor marketing materials including an exhibitor prospectus, sponsor brochures, postcards, direct mail pieces, and floor plan mailers. The United Motorcoach Association hosts the annual expo which provides first rate information and support to motorcoach owners, tour and charter operators, suppliers, vendors, and partners in the bus, motorcoach, travel and tourism industries. Fairfax, VA-based Naylor CMG manages exhibit sales for the Expo, which attracts more than 2,000 attendees each year. Frost Miller Group has worked on eight different tradeshow with NaylorCMG since 2005.

Kelly Electric has just completed the electrical installation of a 1.8 megawatt rooftop solar project for **Constellation Energy in Belcamp, MD**. This is the largest single rooftop solar installation in the state of Maryland. Constellation Energy financed the project and will own and maintain the solar power system for a period of 20 years. McCormick purchases energy produced by the solar installations hosted at its facilities. Structuring solar projects in this way

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creates an attractive business model that creates no upfront costs for customers and provides them with firm power costs over a long term. McCormick is estimated to save \$3.4 million in electricity costs over the term of the agreement.

With the completion of the McCormick project Kelly Electric is now up to 3.8 megawatts of contracted electrical installations for solar photovoltaic (PV). Kelly is currently working on another project at **Coppin State University with Constellation Energy** which will total 500KW when completed.

In 2009, John E. Kelly & Sons Electrical Construction, also known as Kelly Electric, completed the installation of their own solar PV generating system at their offices in Upper Marlboro, MD with Standard Solar and Washington Gas Energy Services. The system of nearly 150 kW produces about 60% of Kelly's electrical power needs, saving the company money while demonstrating environmental responsibility and leadership. Other projects that Kelly Electric has been involved with include the 2009 Solar Decathlon for the Department of Energy, 420 kW install at Catholic University in DC for Standard Solar, three systems for SunEdison totaling 316 kW, and a 585 kW system at NIST in Gaithersburg for Legatus6. Kelly Electrical is currently working with many industry professionals to create renewable energy projects; the firm also installed wiring for a demonstration solar generating project at Sousa Middle School in Washington, DC with Standard Solar. This project, sponsored on President Obama's National Day of Service by the League of Conservation Voters, was attended by the Secretary of Energy Dr. Steven Chu.

American Wind Energy Association (AWEA) has achieved LEED Gold certification from USGBC. **GPI/Greenman-Pedersen, Inc.** and its architectural partner provided architectural and engineering design services for the renovation of this 30,000 square-foot Washington, DC office. Design applications included a Construction IAQ Plan, Low Emitting Materials, Lighting 22% less than ASHRAE 90.1, Zoning HVAC System

for particular space plan, and a Long Term Lease Commitment. The project was designed to meet ASHRAE 62.1 ventilation requirements and ASHRAE 55 comfort criteria. This resulted in better occupant comfort and a healthy work environment. The LAN room unit is the only new HVAC equipment and it uses a non-CFC refrigerant and complies with energy requirements. The 22% less energy usage in the lighting design was achieved by providing lower general illumination levels and utilizing task lights to raise the levels to IES recommendations at the work surface.

Tishman Construction Corporation (TCC), one of the world's leading builders, completed the **expansion of the Pennsylvania Convention Center**

in Philadelphia, Pa. three months ahead of schedule and within its \$786-million budget preparing for an early March opening of the Convention Center Expansion. TCC, which is part of AE-COM Technology Corp., a *Fortune 500* provider of professional technical and management support services for government and commercial clients around the world, is working on the project as Construction Manager with joint-venture partner Joseph Jingoli & Son.

The Convention Center's expansion includes construction of 935,000 square feet of new space, yielding more than 528,000 square feet of contiguous exhibit area. Included in the scope are a new Main Entrance atrium lobby, extension of the Arch Street Concourse,

23 additional meeting rooms, three additional exhibition halls, offices, a 56,000-square foot ballroom, and a new central power plant, along with associated utility and support spaces. The expansion spans across 13th Street creating an underpass, and extends a city block to Broad Street with the newly constructed grand atrium entrance. **B**

Project Highlight

Army Test & Evaluation Command Headquarters

Headquarters: WBC member, Foulger-Pratt Contracting, LLC, is pursuing LEED Gold Certification for Army Test & Evaluation Command Headquarters (ATEC HQ), currently under construction on Aberdeen Proving Ground, in Aberdeen, Maryland. The building, scheduled to open this summer, is over 140,000 gsf, and will support over 600 personnel. The completed facility will be the only BRAC project and the first Department of the Army facility to be certified LEED Gold. Among the credits expected to achieve the certification from USGBC, are “Maximize Open Space”, “Enhanced Refrigeration Management”, “Views for 90% of Spaces”, and “Heat Island Effect -Roof”. The building’s highly efficient mechanical and electrical systems will provide a 30% energy savings from a standard energy model.

Solar Energy Gets a Big Boost

Have you considered solar energy but found the economics uninspiring? You might want to look again. Under the federal Modified Accelerated Cost-Recovery System (MACRS), businesses may recover investments in certain property through depreciation deductions. A number of renewable energy technologies are classified as a five-year property including a variety of solar-electric and solar-thermal technologies.

The federal Economic Stimulus Act of 2008, enacted in February 2008, included a 50% first-year bonus depreciation provision for eligible renewable- energy systems acquired and placed in service in 2008. But in the December 2010 debate between President Obama and House Republicans over tax cuts and unemployment benefits extensions, the provision for bonus depreciation was amended and extended yet again by The Tax Relief, Unemployment Insurance Reauthorization, and Job Creation Act of 2010. Under these amendments, eligible property placed in service after

September 8, 2010 and before January 1, 2012 qualifies for 100% first-year bonus depreciation.

The bottom line—solar energy has never been more affordable - after taxes of course. The combined effect of the Investment tax credit (30%), MACRS (~42%), and falling panel prices are yielding returns on investment of ~18% in Virginia, and up to 30%+ in Maryland and DC. 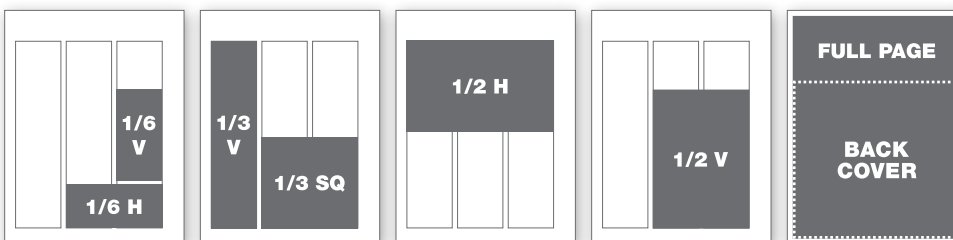
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


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
