



77th Chairman Will Lead WBC in Brand Refresh

amara McNulty's introduction to the construction industry came far before she joined the Washington Building Congress (WBC) in 1998. Hailing from a construction family, McNulty attended University of Wisconsin and entered into an architecture program and though she later changed to law, graduating with her J.D. from University of Wisconsin Law School, she wouldn't stray far from her roots. As 2014-2015 Chairman, she plans on using her extensive background to not only move the WBC to a new location, but lead it through the process of refreshing its brand.

As 77th Chairman, McNulty will be focusing on two major goals for the WBC. She will lead the WBC's move to a new location in March. With the help of member volunteers she will work on a new design of both the association and new office space to welcome the WBC to its new location.

She is accustomed to working with her clients from the onset of both large and small scale projects in order to avoid potential claims and disputes down the line, not to mention she regularly assists clients in drafting and negotiating complex contracts, making



her the perfect person to take on the new goals of the WBC in the coming year.

McNulty joined the WBC in 1998, and promptly joined the membership committee. She said, "I liked its inclusive nature, everyone who touches the construction industry is welcome." And McNulty continued to see that through during her time on the committee, including the implementation of the Hammerheads Group. The group was a "sort of off-shoot of the membership committee" catering to the under-40 members. Their goal was get the younger generation of the construction industry involved at an early stage. Over the past 16 years McNulty has become an integral part of the WBC and served on the board of directors.

McNulty lives in Arlington, VA with her husband and two dogs. In her spare time she enjoys travelling and spending time with her dogs and while she doesn't like to consider herself a "foodie" she loves trying new foods and restaurants.



The project, owned by Douglas Development and designed by GTM Architects, is located across the street from the Rhode Island Avenue metro station in the developing Brentwood neighborhood of Washington, DC.

SIGAL Construction Corporation has completed the following interiors projects in August: a renovation of the Liberty Place lobby at 325 7th Street NW and an interior build-out of the National Disability Rights Network at 900 2nd Street NE. The 3,000 square-foot Liberty Place repositioning project included both the lobby and canopy at 325 7th Street NW. The complete tenant build-out of the National Disability Rights Network (NDRN) included demolition, new partitions, ceilings, carpets, millwork, glass detailing, electrical, plumbing, sprinkler and HVAC systems.

SIGAL Construction Corporation celebrated the Dedication and Ribbon Cutting of Edward M. Felegy **Elementary School** located in Hyattsville, Md. awarded the new construction of North Capitol Commons in the NoMa neighborhood of DC. This 87,000 square-foot mixed-use residential community is located on one of the main roads leading to the United States Capitol, offering residents monumental views of the north and south of North Capitol Street. The building will provide affordable housing units including housing for veterans. The 14-story building will consist of 12 floors of micro studio apartments (124

units) over office and retail spaces on the ground level and community/office spaces on the second floor.

Grunley Masaro Construction, LLC, was selected by Montgomery College to renovate the Science West Building on its Rockville campus. The building, constructed in 1971, requires additional space to accommodate the demand of students seeking high-quality programs in science, engineering, and mathematics. The work will entail renovation to the existing 69,000 square-foot, two-story building which will house new classrooms, laboratories, a math emporium, open study areas, a lecture hall and an administrative suite.

Donohoe Construction Company has officially commenced construction on the site at 1111 New Jersey Avenue, SE, atop the Navy Yard-Ballpark Metro station. Delivery is scheduled for summer 2016. Known as Gallery Capitol Riverfront, the 13-story tower will contain 324 luxury apartment units above three levels of below grade parking. The building will have approximately 11,000 square feet of ground floor retail space, most of which will be located at the corner of M Street and New Jersey Avenue.

Balfour Beatty Construction has been selected by the Marine Corps Heritage Foundation (MCHF) to provide preconstruction and construction services for the final phase of the **National Museum of the Marine Corps (NMMC)**. This project is the second Balfour Beatty Construction engagement with the NMMC. The company completed the first phase of the NMMC in 2006. The nearly 125,000 square-foot expansion of the exhibit galleries will document the Marine Corps' history from the end of the war in Vietnam to present time and will include a large screen theater, student education center, an expansion of existing second-level administration space, Tun Tavern and kitchen. B
