

Brett Snyder, the Washington Building Congress (WBC) 82nd Chairman of the Board, introduced the video. "I would like to congratulate all of the 2020 winning craftsmen and thank our outstanding sponsors, nominators and the Craftsmanship Awards Committee. I would also like to thank our membership whose ongoing support and participation make this event possible.," said Brett Snyder.

Since the inaugural awards ceremony in 1956, the Craftsmanship Awards program has become one of the most recognized events in the industry. More than 12,700 men and women have been recognized for their craftsmanship on more than 3,300 winning entries.

The awards presentation began with the induction of the 13th WBC Craftsman Hall of Fame class. Established in 2008, the Hall of Fame prominently recognizes the best craftsmen in our industry and currently has 41 exceptional members. Up to five deserving craftsmen or women may be nominated by the WBC Craftsmanship Awards Committee and approved by the WBC Board of Directors to be inducted in the Craftsman Hall of Fame. Selection of the Hall of Fame inductees is based on the number of awards an individual has received, the individual's time in the building industry, and other factors that may be relevant.

For the 2020 Craftsmanship Awards, WBC received 259 nominations in 10 trade categories from sitework to finishes. With the outstanding support of 172 volunteer judges, 39 teams went out in early-January to evaluate the entries. The evaluations were compiled, results tallied, and 85 winners were selected based upon the judge's scoring.

Sixteen firms had winning craftsmen for two or more projects. Teams from Dynalectric Corp. and JE Richards were each recognized for four projects. Overall, 24 general contractors were represented in the awards.

This year, the eight Star Award nominees were selected from the 85 Craftsmanship award winners. In 1992, WBC Past Chairman Darrel Rippeteau created the Star Award to recognize craftsmen who exhibited the highest level of expertise in their trade. Nominated craftsmen are selected by a separate panel of three judges and have exceeded established criteria to achieve a level defined as "Exceptional" in one of the Star Award categories.
