As we reflect on the Year That Wasn't, there is much our industry can be proud of. Many examples of how we pivoted to keep construction moving forward come to mind immediately — from the new technology we mastered on the fly to the creative staffing and shift management needed to limit our exposure to each other in what is inherently a collaborative endeavor. Hopefully, one lasting effect will be the unprecedented cooperation amongst competing companies — working with each other to figure out new safety protocols to keep each other safe and sharing resources to requisition the newly necessary PPE.

Throughout the 2020 Pandemic, the construction industry in the DMV kept working and persevering through these new challenges. In many ways, we were blessed to be designated “Essential Workers,” in that we were mostly able to continue in our jobs. But not all in our area were so lucky, and when it mattered most, our industry stepped up in a big way to help those who were not as fortunate.

Covid wreaked havoc on many job sectors, driving more people in our region out of work and further towards the margins. According to information from the Capital Area Food Bank, the number of people in the DMV who struggled with food insecurity during the pandemic increased by roughly 50%, from 400,000 people pre-pandemic to approximately 600,000 people in March of this year. Over 850,000 people filed unemployment claims during that time.

In deciding how to close out National Volunteer Month this past April, the Washington Building Congress put out a call across our industry for a little help, and you responded in an incredible way! With little notice, WBC members rallied to host one-week food drives at their construction sites and delivered the results to the Capital Area Food Bank in Washington, D.C. What you accomplished, according to Emily Lauer-Bader, the Food Bank’s Director of Corporate Partnerships, was “Overwhelming!”

Quite literally, they could not keep up with the influx of food our industry provided so the full impact of your generosity cannot be measured. But here’s what we do know:

- Over 20 companies and over 60 construction sites participated in the event
- While we don’t have complete records, approximately half of the sites that participated managed to collect and donate nearly 18,000 lbs. of food!
- In addition to the food, monetary donations were made by Schindler Elevator and R&R Mechanical, which the Capital Area Food Bank estimates will provide an additional 14,400 lbs. of food! Special thanks for those generous donations.
- The known total impact from this event was over 32,000 lbs. of food, which is enough to provide approximately 26,000 meals to families here in the DMV!





The results are simply staggering and exceeded all expectations — especially for a first-time food drive.

While the vaccine has gone a long way to paving the path back to normal and allowed many people to return to work, we still have a long way to go to alleviate the hunger crisis in our region. WBC continues to partner with the Capital Area Food Bank through volunteer events where you can work in the warehouse and package food boxes for delivery to families. It is an incredibly rewarding and family-friendly way to help others in our region. Please keep an eye out for upcoming volunteer opportunities from the WBC Community Services Committee. And please keep CAFB in mind when thinking about supporting the community with your personal or corporate donations. CAFB plans to provide more than 50 million meals over the next year to your neighbors throughout the DMV! Find them at www.capitalareafoodbank.org.

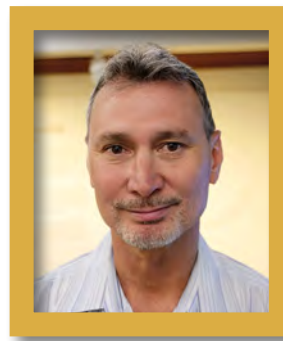

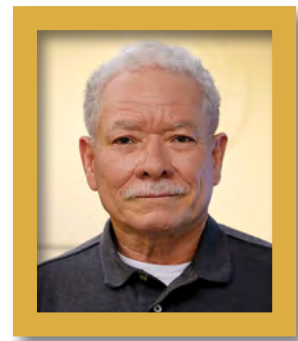
Over the last 64 years, the Craftsmanship Awards program has become one of the most recognized events in the industry. Since 1956, more than 13,200 men and women have been recognized for their craftsmanship on more than 3,400 winning entries.

The awards presentation began with the induction of the 14th WBC Craftsman Hall of Fame class. Established in 2008, the Hall of Fame prominently recognizes the best craftsmen in our industry and currently has 44 exceptional members.

Up to five deserving craftsmen or women may be nominated by the WBC Craftsmanship Awards Committee and approved by the WBC Board of Directors to be inducted in the Craftsman Hall of Fame. Selection of the Hall of Fame inductees is based on the number of awards an individual has received, the individual's time in the building industry, and other factors that may be relevant.

For the 2021 Craftsmanship Awards, WBC received 278 nominations in 10 trade categories from sitework to finishes. Supported by 120 volunteer judges, 43 teams met in April to evaluate all the entries. 243 were judged in person and 35 virtually. The scores were compiled, results tallied, and 90 winners were selected based upon the judge's evaluations.



Brett Snyder, past WBC Chairman of the Board, introduced this year's Hall of Fame Inductees.

Following the determination of award winners, a separate panel of three judges was selected to evaluate the Star Awards nominees. The Star Awards were introduced in 1992 to recognize craftsmen exhibiting the highest level of expertise in their trade.

This year, eight of the top scoring Star Award nominees were selected from the 90 award winners. Nominated craftsmen achieved a level defined as "Exceptional" in one of the Star Award categories. The three Star Award categories are: Excellence in the Face of Adversity, Technical Excellence, and Visual Excellence.
