
Dominion Electric Supply Celebrates 75 Years


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















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2015 Annual WBC Craftsmanship Awards

Our Area's Most Talented Craftsmen Honored by DC's Building Industry

In March, Washington's building industry came together at the Washington Building Congress' 59th Annual Craftsmanship Awards event to pay tribute to the area's top craftsmen and women. More than 1,000 participated in the evening's celebration.

CRAFTSMANS

"The first Craftsmanship Awards Committee organized the inaugural awards program in the early 1950's, and in 1956 seven craftsmen were awarded certificates of performance for their work on the 10-story Editors Building on H Street, NW," said Tamara McNulty, WBC's 77th Chairman of the

Board. "The Craftsmanship Awards program has become one of the most prestigious events in our industry and is the only program in the metropolitan area individually recognizing craftsmen. As the program has elevated in prestige, WBC's recognition of quality craftsmanship has continued to grow."

In the last 59 years, over 10,500 men and women have been recognized for their craftsmanship on over 2,900 winning projects.

Continuing a more recent tradition, up to five deserving craftsmen may be nominated by the WBC Craftsmanship Awards Committee and approved by the WBC Board of Directors to be inducted in the

Craftsman Hall of Fame. Selection of the Hall of Fame inductees is based on the number of awards an individual has received, the individual's time in the building industry, and other special factors that may be relevant.

The night's three 2015 Hall of Fame inductees were:

- Ronald Borza, Jr. Doors & Windows
- Richard Johnson Metals
- Joe Sieiro Masonry

"These individuals have proven over the course of their careers to be leading examples of what it takes to succeed in our industry," explained WBC Past Chairman Joel Zingeser as he presented the awards.

This year, WBC received 286 nominations in 10 trade categories from site work to finishes. With the participation and support of 159 judges, teams of evaluators went out in early January to evaluate all of the nominated projects. The evaluations were compiled, results tallied, and 80 winning entries were identified based upon the judges' scoring. Very few companies had winning craftsmen on more than one or two projects, however craftsmen from **Power Solutions, Inc.** were awarded for five projects and craftsman from four of **Singleton Electric Company**'s projects received praise.

The Whiting-Turner Contracting Company was general contractor on 13 projects; Clark Construction Group was general contractor on 11 projects; and HITT Contracting Inc. and DAVIS Construction were each

general contractors on nine projects.

Following the selection of the award winners, a separate group of Star Award evaluators representing different perspectives and disciplines within our industry was selected to independently evaluate the Star Award nominees. Eight outstanding entries were recommended for this distinction for demonstrating the highest level of quality and exceeding the awards criteria to achieve a level defined as "Exceptional." From these, the Star Award winners for Visual Excellence,

Technical Excellence and Excellence in the Face of

Adversity were selected.

This year, the Star Award for Excellence in the Face of Adversity was awarded to the team of Noe Flores, John Houghton, Abe Massalley, Pat McDonough, Wilfredo Rodriguez and Mark Valentine with Flippo Construction Company for Bridges at Courthouse Road & 10th Street – Special Construction – Bridges and Highways.

Limber Lazarte-Castro, Carlos Escobar, Merrill Poe, Orlando Rivera, Robert Turner and Landon Walker with C.J. Coakley Company were honored with the Star Award for Technical Excellence for their *Plaster* work at the Virginia Theological Seminary – Immanuel Chapel.

Finally, the Star Award for Visual Excellence was presented to two groups of craftsmen who worked on different aspects of a lobby renovation performed at 1275 Pennsylvania Avenue: Gerald Blunt, Thomas Brown, Dominic Comella, Ton Hong, Mark North and Chris Ridge with Columbia Woodworking for the *Architectural Millwork*, and Dario Acosta, Victor Lemus, Kenny Morgan, Wilfredo Orellana and Wilson Orellana with R. Bratti Associates for the *Interior Stone & Marble* work.







Site mobilization is underway and the project is scheduled for substantial completion in July 2016.
