

Over 1,100 individuals from all aspects of the Washington Metropolitan area's building industry gathered on March 16th to honor our region's superior craftsmen

and women at the Washington Building Congress' 62nd Annual Craftsmanship Awards banquet and ceremony. More than 12,000 individuals have been praised over the past 62 years for their craftsmanship on thousands of award-winning projects.

"The first WBC Craftsmanship Awards Committee organized the inaugural Craftsmanship Awards program in 1956.," said Dan Buckley, WBC's 80th Chairman of the Board. "Over the years, the awards program has become one of the most prestigious events in our industry. We are proud to host the only high-level program recognizing the individual contributions of craftsmen working on jobsites every day."

Ahead of the traditional Craftsmanship Awards, the presenters took time to announce the WBC Craftsman Hall of Fame's inductees for the evening. Up to five deserving craftsmen may be nominated by the WBC Craftsmanship Awards Committee and approved by the WBC Board of Directors to be inducted in the Craftsman Hall of Fame.

Selection of the Hall of Fame inductees is based on the number of awards an individual has received, the individual's time in the building industry, and other factors that may be relevant. Established in 2008, there are currently 38 members of the Hall of Fame (including those added at the ceremony).

The night's two 2018 Hall of Fame inductees were:

- Bruce Baldwin, Electrical
- · Anna Torre-Smith, Finishes

"These individuals have proven over the course of their careers to be leading examples of what it takes to succeed in our industry," said Buckley.

WBC's Chairman of the Board also honored an individual who has contributed greatly to the Washington Building Congress, and the area's building industry, over the years with a special WBC Board Service Award.

"I would like to take a moment to recognize someone here tonight who has made significant contributions to both WBC and our industry," said Buckley. "Mr. Darrel Rippeteau, founder of Rippeteau Architects, past WBC Chairman of the Board, creator of Craftsmanship Star Awards, and the force behind Builders Ball, announced his retirement at the end of 2017."

The 2018 Craftsmanship Awards program received 255 outstanding nominations, continuing the long-standing WBC tradition of recognizing the craftsmen in all areas of the building trades. Nominated entries were judged by independent evaluators on the basis of creative ingenuity, precision and quality craftsmanship. Factors such as complexity, schedule, level of coordination and technical requirements were considered as part of the overall evaluation.

With the valuable support of 161 volunteer judges, 37 evaluator teams went out in early January to view all of the nominated projects. The evaluations were compiled, results tallied, and 84 winning entries were identified based upon the judges' scoring. Few companies had winning craftsmen on more than one or two projects, however craftsmen from Singleton Electric Co., Inc. were recognized for five projects and craftsman Clark Foundations, Inc. received awards on four projects. Clark Construction Group, LLC was general contractor on 19 projects, GCS-SIGAL, LLC was general contractor on ten projects, and **DAVIS Construction** and **HITT Contracting** were each general contractor on eight projects.

Following the selection of the award winners, a separate group of Star Award evaluators representing different industry perspectives and disciplines independently evaluated the Star Award nominees. Eight outstanding entries were recommended for this distinction for demonstrating the highest level of quality and exceeding the awards criteria to achieve a level defined as "Exceptional." From these, the Star Award winners for Visual Excellence, Technical Excellence and Excellence in the Face of Adversity were selected.

"In 1992, Craftsmanship Awards Chairman Darrel Rippeteau created the Star Awards," said 2018 Craftsmanship Awards Vice-Chair Karen Cotton of HITT Contracting. "Star Award winning craftsmen encompass the key characteristics of all Craftsmanship Award winners and exhibit the highest level of focus on the essence of excellence."

This year, the Star Award for Excellence in the Face of Adversity was presented to **Matt Baublitz**, **Jon Borys**, **Thomas** Boschert, Chris Hayden, David Pecora, and Chris Windsor with Diversified for their work on the U.S. Capitol, House of Representatives Chamber Sound System Upgrade.

The Star Award for Technical Excellence was awarded to the team of Pedro Fuentes, Thaddeus Gerald, Daniel Miranda, James Michael Thornhill, Antonio Vasquez, and **Dionision Vasquez** with **Sunbelt Rentals Scaffold Services** for their outstanding **Scaffolding and Rigging** work at the **Duke Ellington School of the Arts Modernization.**

Dave Aguilar, Joe Batista, Ron Jones, Jeremy King, Bobby Rivers, and Chris Singh with Tate Ornamental were honored with the Visual Excellence Star Award for their Ornamental Metal work at the Museum of the Bible.





The solution called for a pair of directional antenna's extending the Turner LAN from the construction trailer to the Construction Site via and AP's placed throughout the job site providing access to the outside world for all mobile devices.

"Providing Wi-Fi to our construction team provides efficient flow of communication to our mobile devices inside the building. We look forward to increasing our use as we move forward with interior construction," said Nick Sevier, Project Superintendent.

The 511,000 square foot replacement hospital for Adventist Healthcare Group will expand access to patient care in the region.

Washington Adventist Hospital will move its acute-care operations to the new facility, which offers 170 additional patient beds, including 28 intensive care beds, 16 intermediate care negative pressure beds, and 22 maternity beds, operating rooms, and angiography labs for cardiology.


The facility will also feature eight observation beds within the medicalsurgical units, as well as an emergency department with 34 treatment bays and 12 clinical decision beds.
