SIGAL Completes "Architecture in the Schools" Volunteer Program

WBC member, SIGAL Construction Corporation participated in the AIA DC and Washington Architectural Foundation's Architecture in Schools volunteer program this past spring. Kristina Castro, a project manager at SIGAL and Registered Architect, led the volunteer effort at SIGAL. For eight weeks, Castro and numerous SIGAL employees spent one hour each week at Kings Glen Elementary School in Springfield, VA teaching sixth grade students about construction and architecture.

The students had recently studied the 13 colonies and Castro developed a curriculum of slideshows and project based activities to teach the basic principles of architecture such as function, materials, aesthetics, structures, scale and drawing conventions through colonial architecture. One student said that their favorite part of the program was making the gumdrop tower and learning that triangles are stronger than squares during the structures lesson.

To teach scale and proportion, Castro had the students measure each other, draw themselves to scale and then make a pipe cleaner scale figure to illustrate how human proportions dictate the size of buildings and elements. The program concluded with the final project titled "Model of Freedom" where the students used the principles learned to design and build 3D scale models of their own free room. The function of their room could be anything they wanted; the ultimate video game room or even the never-ending pizza room.



The project was headed up by House Captain Kent Fee (Lehman Smith McLeish) and Co-Captain Ken Ellis (Langan Engineering & Environmental Services), along with the Community Services Committee and Chair Jane Cherney (McCoy Associates). Thank you to all of the outstanding volunteers and supporters of this annual WBC community service project. The group once again went well above the typical scope of work to accomplish this rewarding undertaking.

Rebuilding Together, a non-profit organization devoted to rebuilding communities and preserving affordable housing, is the nation's leading nonprofit group working to preserve affordable homeownership and revitalize communities across the country. The organization has over 200 affiliates with thousands of volunteers who every year rehabilitate and improve the homes of low-income people at no cost. Recipients of Rebuilding Together services include the elderly, disabled, military veterans and families in need.

Community Services Committee Vice-Chair Kent Fee was honored to serve as House Captain and organized a remarkable team of over 50 volunteers for the workday. Due to the incredible amount of work involved with the project, many tasks were started prior to and finished following the project workday.

Work on the house included accessibility modifications, new lighting, ceiling fans, smoke detectors, drywall repair, new flooring, extensive house & yard cleanup, landscaping, tree removal, ramp & handrail updates, window repair, interior painting and more. The deserving homeowner also received a new dishwasher and garage door!

Donohoe Construction Company has broken ground at 465 New York Avenue NW for the construction of a new Homewood Suites. This 95,303 squarefoot hotel, designed by BBG-BBGM, will include 160 guestrooms in a thirteen-story structure atop three levels of underground parking. The hotel will feature in-room high speed internet access, a business center and fitness facilities. Units will range from efficiencies to two bedroom suites with kitchenettes. Also included in the project is the relocation of a 112-year-old historic building.

Kelly Generator & Equipment,

Inc., a coordinated rapid response organization known for their quality of service and the reliability of their generators, has recently signed an agreement with Generac Power Systems to exclusively represent Generac Industrial Power throughout MD, DC, DE, Northern VA, Northern WV, and Western PA. With this agreement, Kelly Generator & Equipment, Inc. will have access to the newly expanded Generac Industrial Power product line, which offers single generator sets up to 2 megawatts and paralleled power systems up to 100 megawatts.

As a Generac Industrial Power distributor, Kelly Generator & Equipment, Inc. will work with engineers, facility managers, and electrical contractors to specify Generac products, install and commission systems, provide service and maintenance, and more.

Frost Miller Group recently began working on several graphic design projects for American Association for the **Study of Liver Diseases** (AASLD).

AASLD, which serves all professionals dedicated to preventing and curing liver disease, quickly put FMG to work on a number of graphic design projects including tradeshow displays, direct mail, and print and web advertisements.

SIGAL Construction Corporation has completed the fast-track construction for Crystal Tech Fund, a technology venture capital company managed by Disruption Corporation and located at 2231 Crystal Drive, Arlington, VA. The 13,000 square-foot interior renovation of the open floor office space took nine weeks to complete and offers

sweeping views of the Potomac River and Washington, DC.

The large flexible-use space features white-board walls, collaborative work areas and private meeting spaces. The multi-purpose room opens up to the main office space by a moveable garage door partition and can be converted for large seminars, events and trainings. Finishes to the space include open ceilings with strip light fixtures.

SIGAL also celebrates the groundbreaking ceremony on the highly anticipated Arlington Elementary School along with Arlington Public Schools on Wednesday, March 19. The new 98,000 square-foot elementary school will accommodate over 600 students, helping the county achieve a fundamental goal of reducing overcrowding. The two-story building will have an exterior load bearing Insulated Concrete Formed (ICF) wall system and a structural steel floor system. The project also features exterior amenities and play areas including a basketball court.

This project will be the first net-zero energy school on the east coast.

Foulger-Pratt Contracting received an executed contract from The Morris and Gwendolyn Cafritz Foundation for Art Place at Fort Totten. This transformative development is located in Washington DC adjacent to the Fort Totten

metro and deigned by Shalom Baranes Associates. The transit oriented development (TOD) is comprised of 973,000 square feet and is anticipated to become one of the most highly accessible vibrant urban neighborhoods in Washington, DC. The sire is strategically located on South Dakota Avenue, NE between Galloway Street, NE and Kennedy Street, less than half a mile from the Maryland line. It is served by Metrorail's Green, Red, and Yellow line.

Art Place at Fort Totten includes three residential towers up to eight floors above grade for a total of 520 luxury rental apartments (527,000 square feet), including 141 affordable units (of which 98 will be reserved for seniors). Additionally, the project includes two levels of retail space (104,000 square feet), and above and below group parking consisting of 601 parking spaces (274,000 square feet). The project will be registered for LEED certification. Construction is expected to commence in late spring of 2014 and take approximately 34 months, completing in the summer of 2017.

Grunley Construction Company, Inc. has been selected by the Virginia Community College System to renovate and expand the Brault Building on the Annandale Campus of Northern Virginia Community College (NOVA). The building is named for Adelard L.


"Abe" Brault who served in the Virginia Senate for 18 years. This contract is valued at \$11.1 million and will wrap-up in summer 2015, just in time for the start of fall classes. Renovations to the existing 28,100 square-foot building will include installation of all new electrical, mechanical, plumbing, and fire protection systems; elevator refurbishment; new windows and roof; and partial replacement of the façade. A new three-story, 20,000 square-foot addition will be constructed of structural steel with concrete slabs enclosed with a new glazed curtain wall system. Site improvements will include the demolition, expansion, and repaving of the parking lot; associated landscaping; and construction of walkways. Compliance with LEED® Silver for New Construction/Major Renovation requirements is a project goal.

The additional space created by this project will almost double the building's capacity and hold close to 800 NOVA personnel. Once completed, the building will house senior management and administrative offices of the college.

wdg architecture recently began construction on 460 New York Avenue, NW, in Washington, DC, an 11-story condominium in the rapidly redeveloping Mount Vernon Triangle neighborhood. The 63-unit residential tower's prominent site is among the last available in the sought-after community just north of the city's Central Business District. WDG Architecture designed the 66,000-square-foot project for Bozzuto Homes in joint venture with NV Capital Advisors. Eagle Bank is providing the construction financing.

A three-level warehouse/garage constructed in 1929 once occupied the triangular site, which borders New York Avenue to the north and L Street to the south. The aging structure had been vacant and deteriorating for many years, yet the building stood as one of few remaining examples of the city's industrial heritage. The design of 460 New York Avenue incorporates and renews a portion of the textured facade, involving careful replication of the articulated

brickwork using a vintage beehive kiln process. New, energy-efficient fenestration recalls the original steel, singlepane windows.


Northern Virginia Community College leaders, professionals from **SIGAL Construction Corporation** and Perkins Eastman, consultants and construction trades people celebrated the "Topping Out" of the Higher **Education Center at NVCC Loudoun Campus** on June 5, 2014. The celebration marks the final placement of structural steel on the three-story frame structure. Located in Sterling, VA, the new state-of-the-art facility will help the campus continue its expansion and transformation into a progressive education campus; NVCC plans to link up with other Virginia Universities to offer Bachelor's Degrees to its students.

The Higher Education Center is designed to engage the students academically, technologically and socially. The academic facility will house classrooms, labs, common areas, a multipurpose room, and office space as well as a sound isolated recording studio with control room. Advanced telecommunications capabilities will help to facilitate the connection between NVCC and its partner universities.

GCS-SIGAL, LLC has been awarded the renovation and expansion of the Duke Ellington School of the Arts in Washington, DC. This Design-Build project will expand the historic facility from 176,000 square feet to approximately 294,900 square feet in order to accommodate its current and future needs.

Named after composer/musician and DC-native Edward Kennedy "Duke" Ellington, the School of the Arts guides students through a full academic course of study and a pre-professional arts major. The school has received an Exemplary School designation since 2012 and, according to its website, ensures "that our students are prepared for post-secondary education and/or careers in the arts by offering an intensive arts-based program." Originally built in 1898, the building has received three renovations/ major additions since and was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2003. B
