
Shaw Promoted to Vice President

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
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David M. Schwarz Architects, Inc.

The David M. Schwarz Architects Charitable Foundation has had another productive year of generous giving. Here are some of the highlights of our contributions for 2016:

For the seventeenth consecutive year we again funded our firm's Traveling Fellowship program for four architecture students attending Catholic University of America, University of Maryland, University of Notre Dame and Yale University. The award allows students to travel to a place of their choosing for architectural study and each Fellow also spent a ten week period working in our office over this past summer.

We organized and sponsored our eleventh annual gathering of professionals from the local building industry community to construct Gingertown. This year's theme was Gingertown London and included confectionary renditions of well-known London landmarks, such as "House of Peppermint" and "St. Pez's Cathedral". The completed Gingertown was divided and shared with several local charities, including Children's National Medical Center, Saint Elizabeth's Hospital, So Others Might Eat, Family Matters and The Wendt Center for Loss and Healing. Contributing sponsors included DAVIS Construction, Page Southerland Page, and Walter P. Moore.

The space for build out and display was donated by The JBG Companies. We collected well over \$20,000 that will be given directly to the charities mentioned.

Our talented staff continued their support of local architecture education and mentoring. During the spring semester, a group of DMSAS employees visited Mrs. Carpenter-Nickens' 7th grade art class every week as part of Washington Architecture Foundation's Architecture in the Schools program. Our volunteers crafted a lesson plan that integrated with the student's curriculum of Greek history and art. The class applied their lessons at the end of the program by building a number of different Greek temples.

Following the success (and fun!) of this effort, we were asked by the District Architecture Center to plan and host a model making work shop for local children. Focusing on 10-13 year olds, a group of DMSAS volunteers created a 'kit of parts' for our participants to use in creating their own DC neighborhood. Including both exterior elevations and internal floor plates, groups of kids combined their scale models to form a collection of row houses.

Beginning in late March, DMSAS hosted a student through the Washington Architecture Foundation's Design in Action initiative. The program pairs local high school students interested in the architecture profession with participating firms. Eric Horsley, a junior from Phelps ACE High School, spent his spring break shadowing staff, learning about the process of building design, and working with a number of design and rendering tools. Eric worked on a design challenge with guidance from our staff, which he presented at the end of the week during a reception at the District Architecture Center.








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Washington Project for the Arts Gala Space Build-Out

Lendlease has participated in several charitable events this year. In the Washington, DC area, Lendlease participated in:


Guiding Eyes for the Blind

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Member Projects

WCS Construction, LLC announced that Park Chelsea at The Collective has achieved a LEED for New Construction v2009 Silver Certificate this past October. At the intersection of elegance and opportunity rests the award winning, Park Chelsea at The Collective, phase 1 of a 3 phase project ultimately containing over 1100 units. A 13-story multifamily residential building with extensive amenities consisting of 429 units with one 550 square foot retail space and three subterranean parking levels that provide one space for every unit.

Carrying a wide range of sustainable features, the HVAC system in the units utilizes water source heat pumps. The condensing water is also used for the roof top units that condition common areas on the unit floors. These RTUs also furnish fresh air for the entire building. The ground floor HVAC design uses variable refrigerant flow (VRF) heat pumps and their water cool condensers are located on the parking level below. The approximate one acre footprint of the building is covered by a mat slab that is 5' thick for most of its expanse. A three story cistern was designed as part of the parking structure. Water is retained then reclaimed, filtered and pumped up to the roof to be used as make up water for the cooling tower. The diesel backup generator resides on the upper most parking level breeching into and up the exhaust shaft that is also used to provide make up air for the generator. Located two blocks from the Navy Yard Metro Station and one block from bus routes, Park Chelsea tenants have easy access to transit. Building residents can also take advantage of reserved bike parking.

In addition to eco-friendly features, Park Chelsea has top quality design, finishes and appliances, as well as abundant amenities on both the 37,000 square foot ground floor; (one of the largest in the metropolitan area) featuring extensive stonework, high level millwork and the roof with panoramic views of the DC skyline. A lap pool, large fitness facility, yoga, café, catering kitchen, gaming, meeting, library, and garden rooms are on the first floor that also houses the Collective's Leasing Center. The roof contains a tiled pool, covered open living






