







Dome Exterior

- Restore historic exterior surface and ornamentation
- Weatherproof exterior of Dome
- Replace broken windows
- Remove hazardous materials
- Requires scaffolding covering entire Dome
- Donut-shaped Rotunda protector



Dome Interior

- Protect interior Dome
- Repair structural elements
- Introduce life-safety and maintenance systems
- Upgrade of electrical, mechanical and security systems
- Remove hazardous materials
- Donut-shaped Rotunda protector



Dome Rotunda

- Remove hazardous materials
- Restore ironwork
- Upgrade systems
- Installation of new Rotunda lighting
- Repainted to historically appropriate color




Funding authorization is required prior to each of the five phases of construction.


Project Schedule Showing Pre-Phase and Phase Structure with Member Moves



Cannon Building – Physical Features



- Completed in 1908
- 678,791 gross square feet (excluding garage)
- 490,300 occupiable square feet (excluding garage)
- 6 levels (including basement)
- 142 Member suites
- 4 Committee Hearing Rooms
- 316 underground parking spaces
- Monumental Rotunda has historically served as the main building entry and defining feature of the interior






